Whether transmitting CAT scan and MRI images during remote medical consultations or enhancing satellite images, Aerospace and Biomedical Engineer Dervanna Troy-McKoy, utilizes the Mathcad software for algorithmic calculations and presentation.

Telemedicine consultations provide the best medical services to locations where they are not readily accessible. People in remote areas and those without access to higher levels of medical care can take advantage of these image transfers to improve their prospects for improvement. GST allows for physicians in different locations to conduct a consultation via image transmission. This technology is being taken advantage of in the Caribbean presently.

"Math plays a role in everything we do, from picture scrolls to automation," explains Troy-McKoy. "Mathcad allows us to easily blend, or combine two images, while its mask function blocks out part of an image so that processing can be done on the remaining features. These functions are useful in subtracting and rebiasing backgrounds, which improves feature visibility."

Mathcad enables images to be taken apart and reconstructed with only minimal, if any loss during transmission. Compressed images cause the loss of some data, but Mathcad allows for the calculation of more mathematical algorithms and therefore, at most only a slight escape of data.

In addition to scanning human bodies, GST is working in the aerospace field to track satellites. By incorporating digital signal processing, Troy-McKoy is hoping to expand a relationship with NASA. GST is now certified to commercialize NASA technology, so it uses Mathcad to magnify, clarify and reconstruct a three dimensional image outside of the atmosphere.

Troy-McKoy said most of the programs that GST uses function optimally with Mathcad. "Mathcad plays a significant role in our projects," said Troy-McKoy, "Mathcad can be used with large measurement and automation solutions, such as National Instruments and a number of different platforms, so this is the most compatible and feasible program for us."





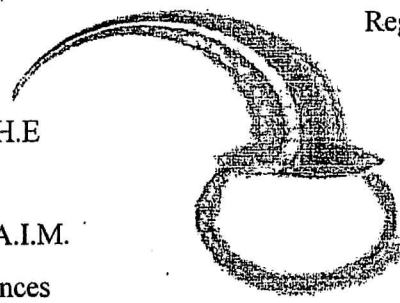
